My daughters, now 25 and 27, were the third generation in our family to attend Camp Oconto, so when we waved good-bye to the bus that first year, I thought I knew what we were giving them, as we released them into the warm care and safe liberty that is Oconto.

And my hopes for them were fulfilled: They (and we) survived the time apart. New activities were tried and skills mastered. Friendships were formed, tested and a few special ones were found to be oh-so-true. And our "go-to" list of role models expanded to include several wonderful counsellors who bridged the sometimes mystifying waters between girl and womanhood with humour and poise.

But, like a seed planted deep out-of-sight to germinate in the fullness of time, I have come to realize that those first times at camp were only the beginning of the collection of experiences lived and lessons learned at camp. These gradually filled a quiver of characteristics that have served and enriched my daughters' lives ever since, and which I fully expect will do so for the rest of their lives. These attributes were mostly absorbed and transferred over many years of repeated exposure, rather than being directly taught or stated. And, by returning to Oconto through numerous years, these were acquired as each girl became ready to hear/see/feel each opportunity. Sometimes the same notion was learned anew in several different ways, as my daughters returned each summer, having become changed by the passing year.

My two lovely, accomplished and humane daughters are who they are, and do as they do, in part because they learned to believe at Oconto that;

- (1) Each person forms a part of an inter-related permanent whole, and therefore every person matters. A lot.
- (2) It *really* doesn't matter which designer label is on your clothes, if any...as long as you get the job done.
- (3) Every single task to be done or role to be filled can be accomplished by a female. Bar none.
- (4) Girls DO want to have fun!!!
- (5) There is such a thing as a fresh start.

I remember when my husband and I were trying to decide at what age to first send our girls, and my "mother-bear" self was concerned that it might be too soon ~ it was my (Oconto alumnus) mother who gently but firmly encouraged us to move ahead. And I think that now I see why: she had seen and recognized the "Oconto" effect on my sister and I through our adult years, as well as in our childhood. She knew, and rightly so, that the camp years would plant early seedlings of personal growth – exciting and encouraging to be sure, and with potential clearly written there. But she also knew that the real harvest would come later, sometimes much later, and that it would be all the sweeter and stronger for the wait.

I feel the deepest gratitude to my parents for this irreplaceable lifelong gift, and I am thankful to our daughters for allowing us the chance to experience it all again, through their eyes, and to Miss Halliday, June and Cliff Labbett and Lisa and Bruce Wilson for making sure that Camp Oconto was here for each of us ¹/₂.


